

RESPIRATORY MEDS

EXPECTORANTS

USED FOR: Nonproductive cough

ACTION: Decrease viscosity of lung secretions; this will make the cough more productive

SIDE EFFECTS: Headache, dizzy, N/V

> Prolonged use: may mask an underlying serious condition for which you have the cough

EX: GUAIFENESIN

MUCOLYTICS

USED FOR: Pulmonary disorders with thick mucus (CF, COPD, PNA)

ACTION: Breaks down tenacity and viscosity of secretions

SIDE EFFECTS: Bronchospasm (watch w/ asthma)
> N/V, Rash
> Headache, dizzy

WATCH: Pts with PUD, asthma, esophageal varices

EX: ACETYLCYSTEINE
DORNASE ALFA

DECONGESTANTS (ORAL + TOPICAL)

USED FOR: Rhinitis, sinusitis, common cold

ACTION: vasoconstricts the respiratory mucosa = ↓ inflammation

Relief of pain and congestion

SIDE EFFECTS: Palpitations, restlessness

> weakness, HTN, nervous

Σ REBOUND CONGESTION Σ

WATCH: If taking with other OTC products

EX: PSEUDOEPHEDRINE
PHENYLEPHRINE

ANTIHISTAMINES

USED FOR: seasonal allergies, urticaria, angioedema, allergic conjunctivitis

ACTION: Blocks histamine at Histamine-1 receptor sites

> Anticholinergic • antipyretic effect

SIDE EFFECTS: itching, sneezing, hives, GI upset, nausea, dry mouth, constipation, sedation, drowsy

Σ FALL RISK

CONTRAINDICATED: PREGGO Σ

EX: 1st GEN: DIPHENHYDRAMINE

2nd GEN: LORATADINE / CETIRIZINE

NONSTEROIDAL ANTIALLERGY

GROMOLYN

USED FOR: 3rd line drug for mastocytosis

ACTION: stops mast cells from secreting histamine

SIDE EFFECTS: Burning in nose, itchy, watery eyes, bad taste in mouth

Σ KEY: NOT QUICK = LONG TERM!

SUBCUTANEOUS ANTI-INFLAMMATORY

OMALIZUMAB

USED FOR: Allergic asthma, chronic idiopathic urticaria

ACTION: Blocks the role of IgE = ↓ allergic response

SIDE EFFECTS: itching, mild rash

> Nausea, dizzy, ear pain

> cold symptoms

> pain in arms or legs

Σ KEY: NOT QUICK
NO LIVE VACCINES d/t immunosupp.
